INTRODUCTION

Life in Christ is a beautiful calling—but let’s be honest, it’s also a challenging one. As we’ve walked through Paul’s letter to the Romans, we’ve been reminded that our salvation is a gift of grace, our transformation is ongoing, and our unity is essential. Yet even with all this truth, living it out can feel like climbing a mountain. That’s why this final message in our series is such good news: *we’re not meant to climb alone*. God gives us the help we need—through His people and His presence—so we can live the life He’s called us to.

FOR REFLECTION AND DISCUSSION

1. We All Need Each Other

Read Romans 15:1–2

- What does it mean to be “considerate of those who are sensitive”?
- Can you think of a time when someone’s encouragement or presence helped you grow in faith?
- In what areas of your life do you currently need support—and how can your group walk with you in that?

2. We All Need All of God All of the Time

Read Romans 15:4–6, 13

- What stood out to you about the promises of God in this message?
- How does Scripture become a source of hope in your life?
- How do you personally experience joy and peace from trusting in God?

3. We All Need to Be People Who Help Others.

- Paul encourages us not just to receive help but to *give* it. Who is someone God might be asking you to build up this week?
- How might you practically encourage someone in your church, family, or workplace this week?
